To the English Coordinator, Public Speaking / Debating Coordinator

We seek your help in encouraging suitable students from «School» to take part in the Ainger Peck Award, a public speaking competition run jointly by the Rotary Clubs of Richmond and Melbourne Park. Now in its 30<sup>th</sup> year, the annual award is open to secondary school age students from invited schools in the Melbourne metropolitan and surrounding areas.


Please note from this year the competition has been renamed the **Ainger Peck Award** in recognition of the outstanding contribution made by the late Rotarian Nigel Peck AM to the success of the Award . Nigel Peck generously funded the heats prize money as well as providing his NHP Conference Centre to conduct the heats for many years.

The Award promotes and enhances communication skills and helps develop the art of public speaking. It is not a debating competition, which is well catered for in other areas particularly for budding lawyers. Instead it will hone skills in confident verbal communication and will give students who take part an invaluable experience. The briefing notes provided in our information pack clearly outlines the requirement of effective delivery of the spoken word with lesser concentration on the argument presented or matter . Guidelines for participants are also included.

A school can enter up to three students to take part in the **NHP** preliminary heats. Entry is free. Entrants are required to speak on any topic for a period of 4 minutes. Each of the heats will have a first prize of \$100, a second prize of \$75 and a third prize of \$50, with an encouragement award of \$40. All entrants will receive an attractive certificate which may be an asset in their future job interviews. Our adjudicators are communications specialists and students taking part can learn valuable hints from their evaluations.

The Rotary Clubs of Richmond and Melbourne Park will provide the venue and adjudicators for the initial rounds. These will be held at the Lyceum, Melbourne Girls' College, 55 Yarra Boulevard Richmond from 7.15 pm to 10.00 pm on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> May, Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> May, Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> May and Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> May. Enter at Gate 2 and parking is available in the college and on the Yarra Boulevard. A light supper will be provided to the students and their families during the event. Parents and teachers are most welcome to attend.

The heat-winner and runner-up will be invited to join in the final of the competition. This will be held at Amora Riverwalk Hotel, 649 Bridge Road Richmond on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May from 6.30pm at a dinner attended by Rotarians and friends. All finalists will be guests of the club, and their families, teachers and friends will be welcome to come also at a cost of \$40 per head. Parking is available in the hotel basement car park.

The winner of the Ainger Peck Award for Public Speaking will receive a winner's medallion and a prize of \$400 at that function, and have their name inscribed on the perpetual trophy. The runner-up will receive \$300 and the third place-getter \$200. The Rotary Club of Melbourne Park's encouragement award of \$125 will also be presented. Previous winners have set an excellent standard. We look forward to your support in this enjoyable annual contest.
