The experience was highly rewarding, he felt, not only personally but particularly for the team members.

They spent a busy month+ seeing and doing a great deal. Hosted for three nights per host family, Merv said their biggest problem was trying to get their laundry done! His impressions: The weather was good, much to his surprise; British drivers are courteous and the pedestrians are all jay-walkers.

By the way, this RC Bundoora meeting was lively, mixing fellowship and Rotary business, and without a guest speaker (except for one with a French accent trying to explain the RI Club Leadership Plan that RC Bundoora will implement next year!). Attendance was 86%, reaching 110% with a few make ups!

To be complete, it is fair to add that it is a 14 member Rotary Club.

However they claim that their 100% attendance goal wouldn't be achieved if every meeting they where not speaking together about it.

**Kate Mactier.** We are sorry to learn that Kate Mactier, wife of past member **Robert Mactier**, passed away on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb after a courageous battle with cancer. Sincere condolences to Robert and his children, Annabel, Lucy and Clementine.

**Boroondara Kindergarten.** Report from Barbara Woodberry. The final figure for our fund raising is just under \$20,000. Thanks to all our supporters, a great result! The money is being spent wisely and is making a huge difference - the kindy is even more alive and the fantastic teachers have an environment more in keeping with their efforts. An open day/working bee will be coming up before winter so that we can all visit and see for ourselves.

And then to our sponsorships. As 4-year-old kindergarten is now totally government funded, we have turned our attention to the **totally unfunded** 3 year-old area. Our 'part' sponsorship of 3-year olds has been very popular - local social workers have filled all ten places with some very vulnerable children. We sponsor each child for \$200 per term (average fee is around \$250) leaving the parent to contribute as they can. This is individual sponsorship, and is quite separate from our fundraising efforts. Thank you to all who have contributed.

The kindy staff are just so appreciative. And I would like to add - they are an inspiration to work with! The kindergarten is highly regarded for its ground breaking work in the multi-cultural area, and RCR can be very proud of its contribution.

Just in case you missed it, this letter was published in the Dec 3rd 2007 BK Newsletter:


