I just wanted to write to you and say THANKYOU. You really made a little kid's day out absolutely perfect.

As you all know, my artificial hip broke after having served me for nearly eight years. The hardened steel alloy broke cleanly above the shank embedded in my femur bone, apparently because of a defect in the original casting. Thus I ended up in Epworth Eastern/Donvale Rehab for about a month after serious surgery lasting $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

My stay in hospital was eased by the many visits from my many Richmond Rotarian friends, who stayed and chatted relieving the boredom of the hospital bed. President Jean Marc called most afternoons having collected my mail from home. Many others wrote or called by to cheer me up. All were willing to assist in any way possible. The Club sent a magnificent stand of flowers which lasted brilliantly for my stay in Epworth Eastern.

This confirmed my view that Rotary is more than a casual gathering of people engaged in helping the disadvantaged at home and abroad. Rotary creates a fellowship of friends whose determination to make the world a better place creates a bond which leads to pride in associate-ing with other Rotarians, and a concern when a fellow Rotarian was a problem. This old widower is grateful and proud of his association with the Richmond Rotary Club.


